Reading:

Class Texts: The Blue Umbrella, The Incredible Book Eating Boy and Flood. These books all link to settings in both urban and countryside. After half term we will be looking closely at The Blue Umbrella which is a Pixar short animation. By linking texts with links to our topic, it helps to allow opportunities to develop creative ideas that we can use in our writing.

In guided reading, we will continue to work on all skills but will mainly focus on finding information and inference.

Writing:

We will continue to work on our grammar skills and using these skills in the application of writing. We will be working closely on our use of paragraphing, fronted adverbials and using a range of different sentence styles to engage the reader.

We will be particularly focusing on upskilling our own writing and editing. We will also be sharing each other's writing and looking at how they can also edit and upskill. In our English lessons this term we will be working towards writing a love story as well as a disaster story.



This term we will be discovering all about forces and magnets and how they work and impact us in our everyday world. During the second half of the term we will be delving deep into the world of plants. We will be looking at their formation and what they need to survive and reproduce. We will also be linking this with biodiversity.



We will begin to looks at Excel and how we can use it to produce and show data in different forms. We will also be creating our own simulations and looking at different programs we can use to present work.

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This half term we are going to be working closely with Emily from Staffordshire mental health term, who will be doing lots of work around self-esteem, kindness and building relationships.

Maths: We will continue to work up on applying and refreshing our KS1 mathematical understanding and how to apply this to our new skills learnt in year 3. Place value and number skills will be continuously accessed through starters, morning work and games.

We will be focussing on building our confidence with the four main operations – addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will work closely with formal written methods and using these methods to solve a range of problems with reasoning.

Fractions will also be a big focus this term as we will once again recap on our previous learning and apply this to a new objective of ordering unit and non-unit fractions as well as adding and subtracting fractions.

Towards the end of Summer 1 we will be tackling time both in digital and analogue form. During Summer 2 we will focus on perimeter and also look in more detail at shape and angels.

Interpret Set UP In our art lessons this term we will be looking closely at prehistoric art and linking this to line drawings of animals native to the UK. To link to our science topic of plants we will also be looking at botanical drawings and paintings. We will also be looking at 3D sculptures and how we can create our own.

<u>D&T</u>: In our D&T lessons this term we will be making our own pneumatic toys. We will definitely be needing lots of cardboard donations so feel free to send us anything you have.

A <u>French</u>: We will be learning about transport related vocabulary along with prepositions to express how we are traveling. During the second part of the term we will look at the circle or life and animals.

<u>Music:</u> K2M: we will continue to learn key notes on our violins and how to read music. At the end of Summer 2 we will be taking part in the Celebration of Music event with lots of other schools from across the county at Birmingham Symphany Hall.

<u>PE:</u> Throughout this term we will be exploring different athletic events as well as developing the skills needed to play tennis and rounders.

Year 3 News: Many children have now moved onto our Accelerated Reader reading scheme. Children must still read at home with an adult, when they have finished a book they will complete a short quiz in school to consollodate their understanding. The children need to be achieving 85% or more to pass the quiz. This term we will be preparing the children for their transition to Year 4. We will be building on their independence skills and making sure that the children feel confident for their transition.
