Reading: Class Text: Our texts for this term are 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' and a non-fiction text called 'Big Cats' We will be reading together, sharing the text . We will be developing their word reading, comprehension and discussion in groups, and with the teacher.


Guided Reading- within our quided reading sessions we will continue to use our phonic knowledge to decode words and developing the fluency of the children's reading.

Writing: We will be studying The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark. This will include researching the common barn owl and writing effective sentences for our stories developing adverbs, dialogue, onomatopoeia and personification. We will then look at non-fiction texts on Big Cats and write nonchronological reports, looking at headings and sub headings, labels and captions.

III History: After half term, we will be looking at 'How was School Different in the Past?'. This unit looks at the differences in how schools were run and how expectations have changed over the years.

Geography: Our new topic is Oceans and Continents, which is predominantly a geography based unit. We will be looking at the location of the continents and how they are made up as well as the physical and human features of the continents.

* RE: Within RE we will be studying 'What do Muslims believe?' and the Christian celebration of Easter. This will include looking at the different beliefs and rituals that that the two religions celebrate.



Reading: 5 times a week as per home/school agreement. This will be monitored on Fridays and children will be rewarded. Books are changed on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

Spellings: Given out weekly, tested on Fridays. Homework: Handed out at the end of the week, due in the following Thursday.

Science: In Science we will be learning about 'Living things and their habitats' We will be looking at what they need to survive Computing: This half term begins with our topic of Spreadsheets. The children will be following the Purple Mash scheme of work. They can also access Purple Mash at home using the format: Initial and surname (i.e. HBowcock) password: red.

PSHE: During this first half term, we will be looking at the 'Happy and Healthy Me' unit.
